Oyster Garden Program:

Improving Water Quality in Manhasset Bay!

As fall brings new beauty, we're thrilled to share the success of our Oyster Garden Program. This summer, we partnered with Councilwoman Mariann Dalimonte, Girl Scout Nicole Maliagros, and Cornell Cooperative Extension of Nassau County to launch Port Washington's first Oyster Garden at The Town Dock.

Community in Action



With the help of 80 dedicated volunteers of all ages, our inaugural oyster gardening season was successfully completed. From July through September, volunteers worked together to nurture juvenile oysters, cleaning cages and tracking their growth. These oysters will be released into restoration areas as part of the Million

Oyster Initiative, helping to improve the water quality of Manhasset Bay.

Environmental Education Update:

Cultivating Leadership: Grades

1-12

Residents Forward is dedicated to nurturing the next generation of environmental stewards, from elementary school all the way through high school. Here's how our Cultivating Environmental Leadership program is preparing students to lead in our community, college and beyond:

IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL WE EDUCATE

Life Cycle of a Backpack (2ND Grade) An

interactive program that connects natural resources — water, air, sun, and soil — to our everyday lives, while teaching students about renewable/non-renewable resources.

Baxter's Pond Study (3RD Grade) A field trip to teach students about pond ecosystems and the importance of recycling and reducing toxins in our waters.

Every Drop Counts: Long Island Aquifers (5TH

Grade) An immersive experience at Bay Walk Park, where students explore the basic hydrology and origins of their drinking water and how pollution affects it.

IN MIDDLE SCHOOL WE MENTOR

Climate Awareness Garden Program (April-

June) An after-school mentorship where middle and high school students learn about square foot gardening and mentor elementary-aged students in sustainable practices.





Youth Climate Summit Planning

Committee: Students in grades 8-12 deepen their understanding of climate issues and solutions, working together to plan the Residents Forward biennial

Youth Climate Summit, giving younger students the opportunity to learn from their high school peers.

IN HIGH SCHOOL WE ACT

Youth Climate Summit Leadership Students play leading roles in the planning and execution of the Youth Climate Summit, gaining real-world experience that enhances their college applications and resumes.



Post-Summit Climate Action Projects Following the summit, students work with mentors from Residents Forward along with changemakers in climate action to develop and implement projects that will help Port Washington thrive in a changing climate.
